Nick owns a little bungalow, its practical, secluded, and shows his independence. Gatsby's mansion is creative, flashy, open minded, carless, and lonely. Buchanan mansion is traditional, narrow minded, plain, boring, dull, and gray.
5. Fitzgerald's description of Tom, Daisy, and Jordan creates not only an impression of physical appearance, but also contains added information. What do you learn about their history and interests, and from their gestures and mannerisms?
Tom is athletic and plays polo, he is a bigot, and only interested in himself. He is blunt and hurtful. Daisy is traditional and comes from a spoiled childhood. Daisy is polite to company but subtle in her forcefulness.
6. When Nick leaves the Buchanan's house, he is "confused and a little disgusted." Why? What does this suggest about his values?
Daisy and Tom are forcing their way into the rumor of his engagement. Nick doesn't agree with their approach and really doesn't understand the Buchanan situation.
