ELIOT</p> <p>Four literary allusions: Conrad Heart of Darkness, the history of Guy Fawkes, Shakespeare's Julius Caesar; Dante's Divine Comedy.</p>	<p>Written in 1925 - between the two wars. Eliot was very depressed / had marital difficulties with Vivienne and his playweeney Agonistes was doing badly. The Hollow men was written in several parts appearing at different times, then he put them together.</p>

"lets pronounce 'we'". Use of repetition - poem has 240 words but 180 different ones. Men is empty and corrupt. Straw effigies - suggest sacrificial burning. These are not real men who feel and act - their words lack meaning. They are empty, spiritually unfulfilled shells. "whisper" - shame, fear / breathless exhalation / articulate. sterile - desolate, drought. empty wine bottles - only women - unable to savour life's goodness / harvest. Paradox - man without purposeful energy. Oxymoron - contradictions emphasize paralysis. Pronoun now 'those' - a select number - possibly Purgatory. They were capable of perceiving the truth, they faced it courageously / faithfully. See revelations - People of Laodicea - neither hot nor cold - God would spew them from his mouth. Men not even capable of direct action, either good or bad - only emptiness. Cannot pity them - just indifference.</p> <p>Shame or guilt HOPE - second kingdom - heaven? hope of the tormented soul to reach his place. reference to Beatrice, his guide through hell in inferno, a section of Dante's epic poem The Divine Comedy - he is too ashamed to look at her. cyclical - song like rhythms in this section. Earthly paradise - broken column - graveyard signifies premature death. Eyes also offer a chance for redemption. Note allusions - similar rural idyllicness. Several references to stars. Man reaches for it but it eludes him.</p>
